Of note: Womancare Midwives was established over 30 years ago in London and effective July 25, 2022 we have now become Forest City Midwifery C.A.R.E. The acronym stands for Choice, Advocacy, Respect and Empowerment. Our intention in changing our name was to reflect the principles of diversity, equity in health care and inclusivity to the greatest degree. It is important to our practice that pregnant people in this community who do not identify as women feel safe to seek care from our clinic.
